

EUROPEAN CUP RACE WALKING

801. PROMOTION AND RIGHTS

- 801.1. The European Athletic Association (hereinafter European Athletics) shall promote a European Cup Race Walking every uneven year.
- 801.2. All rights in and arising from the European Cup Race Walking are the exclusive property of European Athletics. These rights include but are not limited to rights of ownership, marketing, advertising, broadcasting, filming, televising and all or any other means of exploitation. No other entity may exercise any of these rights without the written consent of European Athletics.

802. PROGRAMME, STRUCTURE AND SCORING

- 802.1. The European Cup Race Walking shall be staged on a road course on 1 (one) day and in accordance with the applicable Competition, Advertising, Doping and other relevant Rules and Regulations of the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF).
- 802.2. The programme shall comprise the following events:

- 802.3. The European Cup Race Walking comprises separate events for men's and women's teams representing European Athletics Member Federations.
- 802.4. All European Athletics Members Federations in good standing shall be entitled to participate in the European Cup Race Walking.
- 802.5. European Athletics Member Federations not entering teams may enter athletes to compete as individuals, each event being considered separately.
- 802.6. Athletes may participate in accordance with the following age restrictions:
- 802.6.1. Only athletes aged at least 20 (twenty) years on 31 December of the year of the competition may participate in the 50 km (Senior Men).
- 802.6.2. Only athletes aged at least 18 (eighteen) years on 31 December of the year of the competition may participate in the 20 km (Senior Men and Senior Women).
- 802.6.3. Only athletes aged at least 16 (sixteen) years and not more than 19 (nineteen) years on 31 December of the year of the competition may participate in the 10 km (Junior Men and Junior Women).
- 802.7. Each team shall consist of up to 4 (four) athletes for Senior Men and Senior Women and up to 3 (three) athletes for Junior Men and Junior Women:
- 802.8. The finishing positions of the teams in each event shall be decided according to the aggregates of the finishing places of the first 3 (three) finishers of each team in the

Senior events and of the first 2 (two) finishers of each team in the Junior events, the team with the lowest aggregate being the winner, and so on.

- 802.9. If two or more teams have an equality of scores calculated according to 802.8, the tie shall be decided in favour of the team with the best placed athlete.
- 802.10. Any team finishing with fewer than 3 (three) athletes in the Senior events or 2 (two) athletes in the Junior events shall not be counted in the teams classification but those athletes shall be included as if they had been participating as individuals.
- 802.11. In calculating teams' scores, no adjustment to placings shall be made in respect of non scoring athletes or athletes participating as individuals.
- 802.12. A separate classification of all athletes in each event shall be compiled.
- 802.13. The European Athletics Council shall be entitled to amend or vary the above procedures if it is of the opinion that it is in the interests of the European Cup Race Walking.

803. ENTRIES AND CONFIRMATION

- 803.1. Each European Athletics Member Federation may enter one team (or, alternatively, individuals) in each event (see 802.5 and 802.7).
- 803.2.1. Each European Athletics Member Federation may be represented only by athletes eligible to represent that European Athletics Member Federation in accordance with IAAF Rules.
- 803.2.2. No athlete who, pursuant to IAAF Rule 40, has been declared ineligible to compete for at least 2 (two) years may take part in the edition of the European Cup Race Walking next following the conclusion of the period of ineligibility.
- 803.2.3. European Athletics shall inform the suspended athlete in writing of his/her ineligibility according to regulation 803.2.2 to take part in the next European Cup Race Walking promptly upon receiving notification of such suspension from the IAAF. Any suspended athlete who is of the opinion that Regulation 803.2.2 improperly applies to him/her may, within 20 days of being informed by European Athletics, refer the matter to the European Athletics Council. The athlete may appeal against the determination of the European Athletics Council to the Court of Arbitration for Sports (CAS) in accordance with Article 38 par. 1 to 3 of the European Athletics Constitution.
- 803.3. Preliminary Entries: Not later than 3 (three) months before the date of the European Cup Race Walking, each European Athletics Member Federation shall send to European Athletics (usually via the teams' on-line entry system) a preliminary list of athletes and the numbers of accompanying officials.
- 803.4. Final Entries: Not later than 10 (ten) days before the date of the European Cup Race Walking, each European Athletics Member Federation shall send to European Athletics a final list of its athletes, plus the names of accompanying officials. Final Entry information shall be supplied in the manner to be prescribed by European Athletics (usually via the teams' on-line entry system) and shall include such details as required by European Athletics, including the names and best performances of each athlete.
- 803.5. Final Declarations: Confirmation of the Final Declaration of athletes to compete shall be made according to the procedures defined in the Team Manual.

- 803.6. The starting order for each event will be based on the respective team standings (scoring teams only) of the previous edition of the European Cup Race Walking. Each team shall be lined up behind each other at the start of the respective race. All other teams will be positioned behind in alphabetical order.

804. APPLICATIONS TO STAGE THE EUROPEAN CUP RACE WALKING

- 804.1. Any European Athletics Member Federation may apply to stage a European Cup Race Walking match provided that the proposed venue and city comply with the criteria established by European Athletics

Prior to making the formal application, each potential bidder shall participate in the long term planning by indicating the interest in the annual questionnaire signed by the Member Federation President & General Secretary

European Athletics shall be entitled not to accept any unrealistic announcement or if it was not indicated in the long term planning questionnaire.

- 804.2. Each applicant shall complete the European Athletics official application forms and supply such information and undertakings as European Athletics shall require. The applications shall be completed in English and any application that is not fully and properly completed may be regarded as invalid.

- 804.3. The European Athletics Council shall announce the time- and deadlines for applications and these shall normally include:

- i. Indication of interest in questionnaire of long term planning by 30 November, 4 (four) years before the year of the European Cup Race Walking which is the deadline to be considered as a candidate for bidding.
- ii. Confirmation of candidature, with the name of the bid city, to be made by 30 September, 3 (three) years before the year of the European Cup Race Walking. The candidature form must be signed by the Member Federation and City.
- iii. Formal application to be submitted within 2 (two) months of ii.
- iv. Decision of the European Athletics Council within 6 (six) months of ii.

- 804.4. The written undertakings required to be submitted with the application shall normally include:

- i. The bidding European Athletics Member Federation's undertaking to respect the applicable Rules and Regulations of the IAAF, European Athletics and other competent authorities and to enter into an organising contract with European Athletics.
- ii. A guarantee(s) from the owner(s) that all official sites used for the event, including the competition venue and course shall be free of all commercial and non commercial advertising, identifications and/or franchises.
- iii. A letter of intent by a television broadcaster of the bidders' country to act as host broadcaster in accordance with the requirements of European Athletics.
- iv. The undertakings in writing of relevant national, regional and other authorities that they support the application.
- v. A detailed budget of income and expenditure for the event.

- 804.5. The European Athletics Council shall be entitled to amend or vary the above procedures if it is of the opinion that it is in the interests of the European Cup Race Walking.

805. TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS OF THE VENUE

- 805.1. The European Cup Race Walking shall be staged in a venue and city which are appropriate to the event. European Athletics may establish criteria by which the suitability of a proposed venue may be decided. The city shall be of an appropriate size and standing and the competition venue shall have modern facilities and be fully equipped in conformity with the respective IAAF rules.
- 805.2. The Organiser must provide an electronic disqualification-board.
- 805.3. The Organiser must ensure that the electronic timing is done by chips transponder system.

806. DOPING CONTROL

- 806.1. Doping control shall be conducted in accordance with the respective IAAF Rules and Guidelines and shall be carried out under the supervision of the European Athletics Doping Control Delegate.

807. THE ORGANISING CONTRACT

- 807.1. Immediately after the decision of the European Athletics Council to appoint an organiser, the appointed European Athletics Member Federation shall enter into an organising contract with European Athletics, such contract to establish the respective rights and obligations of the parties in relation to the European Cup Race Walking.

808. THE RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF THE EUROPEAN ATHLETICS

- 808.1. Notwithstanding the organising contract, European Athletics shall retain the overall care and responsibility of the European Cup Race Walking. In exercise of this role, the European Athletics Council shall:
- 808.1.1. Decide the dates, venue and the organiser.
- 808.1.2. Appoint Delegates and other persons (see 811.3).
- 808.1.3. Approve the procedure for deciding the timetable of events.

809. THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ORGANISER

- 809.1. The organiser shall be responsible for organising and staging the European Cup Race Walking in accordance with the organising contract and in compliance with the Rules and Regulations and directions of European Athletics.

810. FINANCIAL REGULATIONS**The Organiser**

- 810.1. The financial rights and obligations of the organiser shall be set out in the organising contract. Subject thereto, the organiser shall be responsible for all costs of organising

and staging the European Cup Race Walking but may retain the income from the sale of admission tickets, approved television and marketing rights, subventions and grants from national and/or local authorities.

- 810.2. For the avoidance of doubt, the organiser shall be responsible for the costs of the following persons:

Delegates appointed by European Athletics (see 811.3); accommodation and board (but not travel) at site visits prior to and at the event.

Staff and representatives of European Athletics specialist contractors and sponsors; according to the respective contracts.

European Athletics

- 810.3. European Athletics shall not be responsible for any costs other than those referred to in these regulations and/or the organising contract.

- 810.4. European Athletics may pay to the organiser a contribution to the costs of up to 2 (two) days' accommodation and board of participating teams as follows:

810.4.1. In respect of Senior Men's and Senior women's teams, 3 (three) athletes;

810.4.2. In respect of Junior Men's and Junior women's teams, 2 (two) athletes;

810.4.3. No contribution shall be made in respect of teams representing the host European Athletics Member Federation.

810.5. European Athletics shall be responsible for all direct laboratory costs connected with the doping control including laboratory costs for tests requested for World or Area Records but excluding tests specifically requested by Member Federations.

810.6. European Athletics shall be responsible for the travelling costs of Delegates appointed by European Athletics at the sites visits prior to the event and staff members travelling costs, accommodation and board when visiting the venue.

The Participating European Athletics Member Federations

810.7. European Athletics Member Federations shall be responsible for all costs (including travelling to and from the venue) incurred as a result of their participation in the European Cup Race Walking which exceed any contributions made by or through European Athletics in accordance with 810.4 above.

810.8. The final account for accommodation attributable to each Member Federation shall be based on the numbers declared in the Final Entries and this shall be paid in full, no allowance being made for subsequent any reduction in the actual numbers of athletes and/or officials.

810.9. Any European Athletics Member Federation which, having agreed to participate with a team, withdraws and does not inform European Athletics and the organiser at least 30 (thirty) days before the first day of the European Cup Race Walking, shall pay to European Athletics as compensation for irrecoverable costs 10000 (ten thousand) Swiss Francs in respect of each team so withdrawn. European Athletics may remit this amount to the organiser.

- 810.10. European Athletics Member Federations are responsible for taking out their own insurance to cover illness or injury to any member of their party when travelling to and from and during the European Cup Race Walking.

811. THE EUROPEAN ATHLETICS OFFICIATING PERSONS

- 811.1. The President, the Treasurer and Director General of European Athletics or their representative(s) shall have the overall responsibility for the care and supervision of the European Cup Race Walking.

- 811.2. European Athletics shall designate a member of its professional staff to be the Project Leader having the responsibility to coordinate the European Athletics Officiating Persons and other staff members and to direct the operational management of the event in cooperation with the organiser.

- 811.3. The European Athletics Council shall appoint the following Delegates and other persons to provide specialist advice and guidance to the organiser:

- 1 Council Delegate;
- 1 Technical Delegate;
- 1 Doping Control Delegate;
- 7 Race walking judges, all of whom shall be included in the respective IAAF panel and domiciled in Europe, 1 shall be the chief judge;
- 3 Jury of Appeal Members (together with a fourth replacement to be appointed at the Technical Meeting);
- 1 Accredited IAAF Grade A measurer.

- 811.4. As soon as possible after the decision to appoint an organiser European Athletics shall inform the organiser as to the names and roles of the European Athletics Officiating Persons and the organiser shall cooperate with and follow the reasonable and proper directions of such persons.

812. PROTOCOL, CEREMONIES, AWARDS

- 812.1. All matters concerning protocol, ceremonies, awards and related matters shall be decided by European Athletics which may, from time to time, establish guidelines.

Opening and Closing and Victory Ceremonies:

- 812.2. Subject to 812.1, the organiser shall propose opening and closing and victory ceremonies of styles and content appropriate to the venue. These may include ceremonies and/or celebrations held either inside or outside the competition venue. Such proposals shall be subject to the approval of European Athletics and shall be appropriate to a European Cup Race Walking.

812.3. Victory Ceremonies:

- 812.3.1. The winning team in each event shall receive and retain a cup to be provided by European Athletics. The second and third teams shall receive a trophy to be provided by European Athletics.

812.3.2. For the winning, second and third teams, the scoring members as well as non scoring members who completed the race shall receive medals.

812.3.3. The individual winner, second placed and third placed in each event shall receive gold, silver and bronze medals respectively, to be provided by the organiser.

Commemorative Souvenirs:

812.4. The organiser shall present all participating athletes and officials with a suitable commemorative souvenir.

813. INFORMATION, NAMES AND ABBREVIATIONS

813.1. All information shall be printed, displayed or announced in English.

813.2. The names and abbreviations of all European Athletics Member Federations shall, at all times, conform to those approved and decided by the IAAF.

814. FINAL PROVISIONS

814.1. All matters not provided for by these Regulations shall be decided by the European Athletics Council.

814.2. These Regulations are drawn up in English.

814.3. These Regulations may be amended by the European Athletics Council.
